Your mission/Position objective:

Under the supervision of the Operational Research, Lead, the Project Manager will work to support key strategic initiatives, implementation projects and operational research aimed at generating evidence for critical diagnostic tools across FIND's disease programmes to drive policy. The Project Manager will collaborate closely with internal and external stakeholders to manage existing projects and initiatives and support the Project Lead to maximize opportunities for data generation to support FIND goals and priorities. The primary objective of this role will be to support the project management and implementation of business processes across FIND modelling and research projects.

The nature of the role will require someone with an innate ability to structure and monitor progress of their work and the work of others, prioritize appropriately, and execute independently. An ability to clearly communicate across tenure and seniority will be essential given the broad degree of stakeholder engagement expected.

Your responsibilities/Job description:

The primary responsibility of this positions is to transversally manage modelling and research projects across FIND's programme', including:

- Under the direction of the Operational Research, Lead, link with other key personnel within FIND, including the Head of Data Services and Biobanking, Head of Market Shaping, Head of Country Preparedness, and Head of ACT-A Diagnostics to effectively identify, structure, monitor, execute (and in some instances independently manage) key projects related to FIND's research agenda and priorities
- Manage internal resources and tools to ensure the success of ongoing modelling and research endeavors,
- Maintain a comprehensive understanding of all relevant research projects, including the ability to cross-pollinate and "connect the dots" across disease programmes

- Support the team to identify key evidence gaps and subsequently generate and implement appropriate solutions
- Draft and manage contracts for vendors or researchers to support evidence generation projects
- Liaise with key internal and external stakeholders to identify areas where support is needed
- Prepare materials for presentation to senior leaders within FIND and other partner organizations related to evidence generation work

Qualifications:

- At least 3 years' professional experience in related fields
- Experience conducting epidemiological research and/or modelling
- Experience independently driving, managing, and supporting multiple projects in parallel
- Strong written and verbal communication skills
- Entrepreneurial mindset, including ability to work independently, self-motivate, and propose and implement new initiatives
- Experience with *in vitro diagnostic* or other medical product introduction in LMIC is desirable, but not required
- Experience working in a LMIC is desirable, but not required
- Fluent in English
- Educational requirements: University degree in a medical/science/data-related discipline
